Treasurer's Report-

New Business-

New Dojos-

Briarwood Kendo Club in Birmingham, Alabama has applied to become part of SEUSKF. They have approximately 20 members and will be led by Yasui, Norio, 4 Dan. Application is approved.

Tournament scoring system and performance tracking system update- Teppei Tsurumi (TKI)

- Tsurumi sensei gave a brief demonstration of the latest version of scorekeeping software. He showed how it can track the strikes for individuals. He explained that currently it has maximum of 12 people and there for would split into groups at tournament. As long as names and scoring strikes were entered in correctly program does rest. Should be a computer at each court and connected to Google drive. The software will be used at tryout as test run.

A question was raised regarding tryout number. Have about 15 interested and want to get to 7 or 8. There is still a potential to allow new interested in but target 2-3 tryouts possibly. Coaches should update advisory committee.

Ishimori sensei has sent a couple of emails and discuss this with others in the past. But we need to be finalizing the list of volunteers in the upcoming months. For GKA, He created a registration list online that other dojo can use.

Each dojo can use link, this will feed all the information for volunteers into the spreadsheet. But we need to set a deadline for this soon, as we are supposed to have a list of volunteers so that we can specify jobs and delegation. Proposed deadline for this is the end of February.

Medical personnel:

It was mentioned that no one had signed up as medical staff.

M. Watson said he could do that if needed and that he has first aid, CPR and AED certifications.

Special assignments:

There are two specific jobs that AUSKF is asking the federation to do:

Sportsmanship pledge: Ishimori sensei was planning to have the Nagano twins take on this task. He suggested to AUSKF that one can do it in English, and the other do it in Japanese. Both members are part of the GKA family. If you have your own candidate or other suggestions, please let Ishimori know. There was a request for help on finding or translating the current sportsmanship pledge into Japanese. GKA uses a pledge that has been handed down to me. Ishimori said to let him know if there was an AUSKF official one.

Kata performance

At the opening ceremony, AUSKF is asking for some performances. N. Ishimori has already lined up Patrick Register sensei to play the national anthem. Now we need two high ranking sensei to perform kata at the opening ceremony. Please let me know your candidate to represent the federation.

Equipment help:

AUSKF would like to have a scoreboard to help keep track of the tournament. GKA has four that we typically use. However, with the tournament being a six courts layout, we need to have 2 more. I believe one of the Carolina dojo have something similar, as I have seen them at one of the SEUSKF tournament (with the kenshi wooden cutout). Could we designate said dojo to please bring theirs?

Registration:

Need 8-10 people to help with registration the morning of the tournament. 5-10 also for other welcome tasks

New nafuda for Jr. team members:

May end up costing more than we had budgeted.

Fundraising

Committee Breakout-

Competition-

Much of competition committee items covered in meeting. Another topic that was brought up however was the possibility of creating a new committee specifically for fundraising.

Education-

Seminar at end of May hosted by GKA. Two 8 Dan sensei are invited. This will be the weekend of the annual GKA tournament and Memorial Day weekend.

Leadership seminar (next BOD meeting). No team practice, just seminar. Contact clubs to get people involved, perhaps down to 1 Dan for dojo leadership.

Look to try to get a seminar in north region, perhaps contact Baltimore Annapolis club to get a seminar set up and have our north region clubs participate.

Promotion-

In going to electronic promotion forms and payment we want to tweak a few items on the forms to reflect all current regulations and costs. In addition we want to make sure the electronic payment of fees for promotion are made separately (menjo fee and promotion fee). Menjo fee needs to be refundable in case person ends up not passing.

Remind promotion hosts that they should be responsible for sending out menjos to passing entrants. BOD will handle promotion registration and fees.

Other New Business-

Increase number of BOD members for SEUSKF? Try to make a decision on this and mechanism it would be happen by for the next BOD meeting.

SEUSKF Fall tournament

AKK would like to host 2019 Fall tournament, target Columbus Day or later in October.

Increase participation in events by individual dojos. Hopefully encourage dojos that haven't hosted an event to do so (with help from BOD). With such a large

geographical area that the SEUSKF Covers it is sometimes difficult to get members from parts of SEUSKF to get involved in events due to travel distances. We would like to make kendo available to all our members but will need individual dojos to help do this.

BOD Meeting request- Ishimori sensei has requested to hold the summer BOD meeting at his house in South Carolina. Weekend of either July 27 or Aug 3 as potential dates. Next BOD meeting will be followed by a leadership seminar.
